Additional orders also for PC-21

The single-engine turboprop training aircraft is used by the world's top air forces to train military pilots. Production of the twelve aircraft is scheduled to start in late summer 2021.

Pilatus products are manufactured almost exclusively for the international market and are therefore subject to great competitive pressure."
